About the program

The USF Louis de la Parte Florida Mental Health Institute (FMHI) at the College of Behavioral & Community Science and the USF College of Public Health (COPH) jointly offer a specialty concentration in behavioral health as part of the Master and Doctoral programs in the COPH Department of Community & Family Health (DCFH).

The Graduate Studies in Behavioral Health Program examines community and family issues in policy, evaluation, systems performance, and outcomes of alcohol, drug abuse, and mental health services. Students with psychology, education, counseling, social work, nursing, medicine, and public health backgrounds analyze current trends and research in behavioral health services.

Behavioral Health graduates will be able to:

- **Summarize the history and philosophy** of the behavioral health services field;
- **Relate fundamental principles of epidemiology** to incidence of mental and substance use disorders;
- **Examine behavioral health programs** for cultural and age specific populations;
- **Examine ethical issues** involved in the care of individuals with mental and substance use disorders;
- **Acquire general knowledge related to the etiology, prevention, and early intervention** of individuals with mental health and substance abuse problems;
- **Assess the social, political, and environmental context** of behavioral health in relation to public health practice; and
- **Critically evaluate the extant literature** related to population-based behavioral health services research.
